God is trying to tell me something again... All God's children are welcome at Epiphany

First I heard from a parent who told me her son said, "Miss Betty-Jeanne said this is God's house, no talking". I said to the Mom, I have said this. We discussed that her son knew the Lord's Prayer and I then told her that we often said it together on the rug. She smiled and I said I would talk with her son so there were no mixed messages being said by me.

At Epiphany our little ones (3-6 year olds) sit on the rug close to the Altar. I do say to them to be as quiet as possible while the service is being said by the priest. However, in my own defense, I never intended for the children to not sing along with a hymn or say the Lord's Prayer.

Then the following week I received "The Living Church", opened the magazine and began reading an article entitled, "Jump into the Stream". This story was about a family with a 2 and 4 year old going to a new church while on vacation. They missed the Family Service, and being good Episcopalians went to the next service available. The 2 year old got fussy so Dad took him out to the Narthex.

After church a woman came up to them and said, "It was very inconsiderate for you to bring your children in here. They don't get anything out of it, and you've running worship for 200 adults."

This article brought tears to my eyes – I knew then that I needed to talk to my class. Obviously I was sending mixed messages to some of the children. I have

been teaching this age for over 35 years and as you see I am still learning from the children, parents and God.

All I need to do is listen for God's messengers and respond.


