Angel of Death and the Choir sang the grand finale "Jeramiah was a Bullfrog."

Epiphany was blessed in 2016 in many ways including the choir growing to more than 20 people singing to the Glory of God. We are truly blessed with their gifts to this congregation that not only include beautiful music but also the long hours of practice and dedication.

Gina Kistle was honored for serving "more years than the Senior Warden could remember" as head of the church school and bringing on new teacher, Leslie Burton. The church school staff deserve praise for teaching the Gospel and spread the Good News to over 50 children currently registered in church school.

Carol Haley was recognized for serving one year on the Vestry and we hope in the future she once again would be willing to say "I am honored to serve on the Vestry."

Susan Baker presented a 2016 balanced budget and thanked the congregation for exceeding 2016's initial

pledge amount - 102% was achieved! Automatic withdrawals has been the best thing to happen at Epiphany because we no longer have the summertime slump and donations are received even when people are unable to attend mass.



As Epiphany plans for a year full of exciting activities, one of the first priorities was to elect



new Vestry members. Congratulations and thank you go out to Mary Ellen Howey, Peter Steinbrenner, and Laura Canon (second term) for agreeing to serve.

After thorough discussion on the 2017 proposed budget, the meeting attendees voted to approved the proposed budget. Delegates and alternates were selected for the 2017 Convention: Susan Baker, Kristen Makhathini, Carol Shaffer, Sandra Miller and the Sr. and Jr. Wardens.

To wrap up the annual meeting, Father started another tradition – "Voices of Gratitude." He invited anyone who wished to say why they were thankful for Epiphany could come forward and speak. Numerous individuals came forward and spoke about their love of Epiphany, how Epiphany is a family and how welcoming we are as a parish.

On the Feast of the Epiphany at 6:00 p.m. 32 people braved the bitter cold to walk the walk that the Wise Men travelled following the Star in the courtyard. As everyone moved from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> Wise Men, the group then entered the Narthex.

Father lead the congregation into the Nave with the Star in complete darkness which finally rested over Mary, Joseph and the babe. It was very moving.

The three Wise Men left their gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh at the altar along with our scrolls (gifts) tied with red ribbon answering the question "What gift would you bring to the Christ child?"

As Father began his homily a slight whimpering could be heard which got louder and louder – yes it was Avery, only eight-weeks old, in Mary's arms. It was a wonderful experience having real people portray the Holy family. We closed with "Joy to the World" and went over to the Meeting Room for a wonderful pot luck.
