Lessons and Carols - Rose Sunday

We listened to the Readings which started with Genesis – Adam and Eve – we moved onto Isaiah where we heard a child had been born – he was named "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Then, of course Gabriel was sent by God to the Virgin Mary and asked to do "the impossible"...but Mary said "Here am I, the servant of the Lord." What faith this teenager had – after all she could have been stoned to death. Joseph too said YES to God and married Mary and she gave birth to our Lord and Savior.

Once again Messengers from God (angels) spoke to the Shepherds announcing Christ birth – "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

Next there were wise men who saw "the STAR" and followed it to King Herod who asked them to return to him after they had seen the child. We all know what was on King Herod's mind and it was not good. Our Choir sang for the first time "A Carol for Epiphany" under the leadership of Kathy Steinbrenner.

As the service closes with the last Reading from John read by Fr. Rick – "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." The passage ended with "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." Powerful even 2000 years later.

Throughout each of the Readings the Choir sang. Many do not realize how many practice hours the Choir spends learning these beautiful hymns. Please take time to thank them for their music ministry.








Annual Chili Dinner
