On a very hot Saturday morning in late August, we had a rare privilege. Thanks to our friends at the Just One Project we got to participate in a "pop-up and give" event. About 20 Epiphany folks helped to bring food, clothing and shoes to a group of people in need. Despite the temperature, there was a large crowd waiting for us. Young and old, all were patiently waiting, eager for the help as the end of the month is particularly hard.

In just under an hour we had distributed 100 backpacks full of brand new school clothes to kids. A number of those backpacks had been donated by Epiphany members and we were thrilled to see the looks on the kid's faces! We also gave out 100 pairs of new Adidas sneakers, in some cases to kids whose

shoes were in tatters. The real mind-blowing number though is 7,000. 7,000 is the number of pounds of food that we gave out that morning. What a blessing!

I could not be prouder of the Epiphany family who enthusiastically embraced this ministry opportunity. The Holy Spirit continues to work among us and it was a pleasure to see so many of our folks taking the mission to the streets and helping those less fortunate.

Foyer Groups Have Reformed by Bill Kohn

Our first round of foyer group meeting was a rousing success! The 35 participants were divided into five groups. After adding and subtracting people, we have reordered into six groups. We're restarting this month and should end up by the end of the year. We've added 10 new people this go-round, four of whom are newcomers to Epiphany. This is absolutely fabulous!

Foyer groups are small groups of 6-8 people, couples or singles, who gather periodically to break bread together. Foyer groups are a wonderful way to get to know others, especially when new parishioners join.

Foyer Groups originally started after WW II in Coventry, England in the bombed-out ruins of the Coventry Cathedral. Small groups, numbering 8-10 people gathered to share food, drink, friendship and communion in rebuilding their community.

Likewise, Epiphany's Foyer Groups 6-8 parishioners typically gather for a social meal where the host/hostess provides the main course and beverages and everyone else brings the rest of the meal. Members of the group rotate hosting the event once a month or so and are limited only by one's imagination. This is not a competition. There is no agenda. It is simply an opportunity for us to be together in a social setting, to welcome newcomers and to get to better know each other.

Each group organizes in its own way, decides when/where to meet and decides the activity. The idea is that each person or couple has the opportunity to host and lead the gathering. Once everyone in the group has hosted, the groups will be reordered and the process repeats itself. The idea is that even more folks and newcomers join the foyer groups when they start next year.
